### **Watch the Presidential Inauguration at Kingsbury Hall**

If you can't make the trip to Washington, D.C. for the presidential inauguration, you can still have a front-row seat to the historic event here at home. The University of Utah will offer a screening of the Presidential '09 Inauguration on January 20 at Kingsbury Hall, streamed live from KUED-Channel 7.

Reserved seating tickets are free but a ticket is required. Tickets are available now at the Kingsbury Hall box office or by phone at 801-581-7100. **Tickets are not available online.** Coverage will begin at 9 a.m. MST (presidential swearing-in at 10 a.m. MST) and will be followed by a panel discussion entitled "A Peaceful Transition of Power: Barack Obama becomes the 44th President of the United States," with Hinckley Institute of Politics Director Kirk Jowers and other political experts.
